**Course Description:** *PsyStart Triage for Victims and Survivors is a system of rapid triage of psychological impact. The system identifies elements of trauma exposure which may lead to long term impact. Identifying exposure allows for stepped care to manage psychological impact. Geocoded data provides Incident Command with situational awareness for operational area and behavioral health resource management. Prepare yourself and your facility to respond to the psychological impact of disasters.*
