- Discuss organizational and administrative policies that must be developed and implemented by Ebola assessment and treatment hospitals in order to increase capability to receive and care for a patient suspected with Ebola Virus Disease
- Describe patient care protocols that have been successfully utilized for the care of patients with Ebola Virus Disease

The National Ebola Training and Education Center (NETEC) is a collaboration between Emory University, the University of Nebraska Medical Center, and Bellevue Hospital Center. Funded by the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Preparedness and Response (ASPR) and CDC’s Division of Healthcare Quality Promotion (DHQP), the goal of the NETEC is to increase the competency of health care and public health workers and the capability of health care facilities to deliver safe, efficient, and effective care to patients with Ebola virus disease and other highly infectious disease through a nationwide and regional network for Ebola and other highly infectious diseases.

In support of this mission, the National Ebola Training and Education Center is providing a two-day training course to US hospitals identified as treatment and/or assessment sites for care of patients under investigation (PUI) for Ebola or those with known Ebola virus disease. In addition, state and local health departments are encouraged to participate and collaborate with hospitals via attendance at these training courses.

This 2-day course held by NETEC is very similar to the 2-day courses held in the winter, spring and fall of 2015 by Emory University and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. This course will cover materials pertinent to both treatment and assessment centers. Upon completion of the course, participants will be able to:

Describe the knowledge, technology, equipment and controls needed to prepare hospitals to receive and care for patients with suspected or known Ebola Virus Disease

Discuss organizational and administrative policies that must be developed and implemented by Ebola assessment and treatment hospitals in order to increase capability to receive and care for a patient suspected with Ebola Virus Disease

Describe patient care protocols that have been successfully utilized for the care of patients with Ebola Virus Disease

Demonstrate appropriate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) selection and donning/ doffing based upon the condition of the patient

Discuss environmental infection control protocols for handling waste and infectious fluids from a patient with suspected or confirmed Ebola Virus Disease.

Describe an effective healthcare worker monitoring plan

Discuss state and regional preparedness plans for patients suspected with Ebola or another seriously communicable disease

The courses will be limited to three staff members from each designated Ebola Treatment or Assessment Hospital and two staff members from the corresponding state health department. NETEC recommends that state health department staff travel with their designated Ebola Treatment or Assessment Hospital staff to increase coordination and collaboration. Additionally, state health departments should prioritize participating hospitals based on the readiness needs in their jurisdiction. Confirmation of attendance eligibility will be communicated to individual registrants by a member of the NETEC. Hospital attendees may include, but are not limited to, medical and/or nursing staff, administration, education/training leadership, and infection control leadership. Staff specializing in communications, occupational injury management, specialized clinical areas, laboratory, facilities management and environmental services are also welcome. In the registration form we do ask healthcare facilities to list the state public health department representative they worked with during their Ebola preparedness activities. This is not a required field but will help facilitate state and regional planning initiatives.

There is no tuition cost for this program. Travel funding is not available through NETEC.

A box lunch and light snacks are provided on Day 1. Breakfast, lunch and light snacks are also provided on Day 2.

All efforts will be made to communicate attendance confirmation with the requested participants within 72 hours of their registration. Hotel information and further course materials will be shared with registrants when they receive their attendance confirmation notification from the NETEC.
